Ponyboy Curtis, the narrator, begins the novel with a story: he is walking home one after watching a Paul Newman movie, and his mind begins to wander. He's thinking he wants to look good on Paul Newman, though he likes his fat looks. He also believes that although he likes to watch movies alone, he wishes he had company for the ride home. Ponyboy steps back from his story to explain that walking alone is unsafe for the greasers, the East Side gang of friends to which he belongs. When they go alone, fat people attract the harassment of socialists, or socs, the rich crowd of the West Side. Ponyboy says the greasers are poorer and wilder than Socs, whom newspapers condemn one day to throw sides and praise the next day for good citizenship. Greasers wore long hair and put fat in it. They dress hard, steal and fight between gangs. They often carry switchblades, mainly to help them stand on the ground against Socs. Ponyboy says he doesn't participate in typical grease because his older brother, Darrel (known as Darry), would kill him if he got into trouble. Ponyboy's parents died in a car accident, so the three Curtis

brothers live together, an arrangement possible only as long as they stay out of trouble. Darry, 20, is the head of the family. He's strict with Ponyboy and often yells at him. Despite his intelligence, Ponyboy has no sense, which frustrates Darry. Ponyboy feels great affection for his sixteen-year-old brother, Sodapop, whose charm and joy he admires. Ponyboy returns to the story of his solitary film walk. As he walks, he notices a red Corvair following him. He accelerates his pace as he remembers how badly sos beat his friend Johnny Cade. Corvair pulls up next to Ponyboy and five Socs climb out and surround him. One of them asks, do you need a haircut, grease? and remove a blade. Socs starts beating Ponyboy, who cries out for help. Ponyboy's brothers and the rest of their group appear on the scene and drive away the socs. Darry starts scolding Ponyboy for going home alone instead of asking for a ride, but Sodapop tells him to stop squerying. The brothers and the other fat men are making plans for the next night. Ponyboy decides that he and Johnny will go to a double feature at the drive-in with their friend Dally. Dally starts talking about his ex-girlfriend, Sylvia, and Ponyboy thinks about the girls who socialize with the greasers. Wondering would be to spend time with a high-class shock girl. At home, Ponyboy, who likes to read, reads Great Expectations and thinks about how his life resembles the life of Pip, the main character in Great Expectations.
